Your library is bigger than you might think. The Northlake Public Library District is a member of the Metropolitan Library System, and it's also part of a shared automation system with 80 suburban public libraries. That means that we have a lot to offer you!

Did you know ...

- You can renew books and other library items online before or on the day they are due.
- You can search the online catalog,

<http://swan.mls.lib.il.us>, and request books, DVDs, compact discs and more at the Northlake Public Library District or any other system library. And it gets easier! If the library has your e-mail address on file, you'll receive an e-mail when the item is at the library for you to pick up.

Otherwise, we'll notify you by mail.

- You can pay fines online using a credit card by going into "My Account" in the online catalog.
- You can return books and other items you checked out from other libraries to the Northlake Public Library District and we'll return them for you.

Stop in, log on and explore.

The library will be closed the following days from January through May:

The library will be closed on Sundays from May 24 through Sept. 6.

New terms in effect for feature video, DVD loans

Do you check out feature videos or DVDs? Take note: Patrons may now check out any combination of four videos/DVDs per household, of which only two may be new. The checkout period for videos and DVDs will remain one week, and there is no grace period for overdue items. The overdue video fine has been reduced to \$1 per day with a maximum fine of \$5 per video. The overdue fine remains \$2 per day for DVDs, with a maximum fine of \$10 per DVD. These changes were adopted at the Aug. 21 Library Board Meeting.

Board OKs use of photos of patrons in library publicity

Adults and children may be photographed or videotaped by library staff or their representatives in the course of library activities, according to a new policy the Library Board adopted at the Sept. 18 Board Meeting. The images may be used without accompanying personal names in library publicity such as the newsletter, Web site, blogs or other promotional materials. If you do not want your children or yourself to be photographed, please contact the library staff.
